A Fair Crack of The Whip for Rural Students



The Country Education Foundation of Australia is delighted to have formed a partnership with Central Hope Cutters in a bid to increase the post high school education opportunities for rural youth.

For so many rural youth, the cost of accessing post high school education and training is often so prohibitive that many miss out on pursuing their goals and dreams, unlike their city counterparts who are still able to live at home and take a bus, train or ferry to TAFE or university, country students often have to move long distances, set up a second home and cope with out their support network around them any longer. Herein lie some of the challenges these young students face in striving to achieve their hopes and aspirations.

Through the establishment of more local education foundations across rural Australia, the Country Education Foundation of Australia is able to help these rural communities create simple, yet powerful community owned groups that fundraises, foster and champion the goals of young people from their community. Young people whose goals wouldn't be possible with out a helping hand from their community. Communities where students have to travel many hundreds of kilometres to attend uni or to undertake most TAFE courses. Through the provision of these non academically based grants, these local Education Foundations have assisted 1047 young students get on their way. Some of these students are assisted with a one off grant at the beginning of their studies, while others will receive two or three grants over the life of their studies or training.

As one young grant recipient said '*getting a grant from my local education foundation showed me my community believes in me and wants me to succeed. It makes me want to achieve even more, not just for me but for everyone who helped me get on my way*'. It is this real commitment to succeeding that results on 98% of our grant recipients completing what they set out to do. As another young student said '*How can you fail when so many people are behind you, wanting you to achieve*'.
