TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. The standard Australian Livestock & Property Association Ltd (ALPA) terms and conditions for livestock sale apply to livestock sales made at the Armidale Futurity Prospect Sale. A copy of the ALPA terms and conditions will be available at the Armidale office of Ray White Rural (95 Faulkner Street, Armidale).
2. All horses offered for sale at the Armidale futurity Prospect Sale must be either a Registered Australian Quarter Horse or a Registered Australian Stock Horse. No foal recorded horses or A.S.B (Breeding Purpose Only) horses will be accepted. All stallions or colts, 2years and over at the time of the sale must be Sire registered and DNA recorded. Any horses accepted as a colt cannot be sold as a gelding. Horses must be registered prior to nominating for sale. If the horse's registration has not been finalised by the close of nominations, the Selling Agents cannot accept the entry form.
3. Nomination/ Entry forms cannot be accepted unless submitted with a copy of the horse's original Registration Papers. Original registration papers and signed transfers are required when presenting horses for inspection. All nominations must be submitted by the closing date. Nominations will not be accepted unless accompanied by the entry fee. There will be no refunds of the entry fee or substitutions of horses unless a vet certificate is supplied prior to the sale and within 24 hours of withdrawal. Nomination forms without a vendor's signature cannot be accepted.
4. The owner is responsible for checking that the information on the horse's registration certificate is correct at time of nomination, i.e. sex, colour, brands, markings etc. owners are advised to review the relevant Society's (i.e. ASHS or AQHA) regulations to horse identification obtainable from the relevant society, in particular the verification of brands and markings policies. A horse would be rejected from the sale under the relevant identification regulations which AQHA and ASH carry due to brand or significant marking discrepancy. Horses must be presented to the satisfaction of an appointed inspector and may be vet checked prior to sale commencement. The inspector may reject a horse from the sale if the horse does not comply with the following conditions:
 - (a) Markings and brands described on the horse's registration papers MUST be clearly visible and identical to the horse present at inspection
 - (b) The horse should be presented suitably for the sale; and
 - (c) The horse should be free of undesirable characteristics and confirmation faults as per AQHA and ASHA Regulations (obtainable from the relevant Society)
5. Where the vendor has retained semen or embryos, then this fact must be disclosed by the vendor to the auctioneer prior to the sale of the lot. The auctioneer will disclose these facts at the time of sale.
6. A fee of \$500 plus GST will be payable by the vendor to the agents in respect to each lot catalogued.
7. Any person involved with handling the horse on the day of the sale, within the perimeter of the grounds i.e. strapper, handler, trainer, rider and the like does so at their own risk. An equestrian helmet approved by the Australian Standards Association or International Equivalent with a chinstrap securely fastened MUST be worn by all riders/ competitors under 18 years of age when riding within the perimeter of the grounds, not just in the ring.
8. The sale committee reserves the right to restrict sale entries pending venue conditions.
9. By nominating a horse in the sale, I/we agree to be bound by any Rules, Regulations and Codes of Conduct which will be available at the Armidale branch of Ray White Rural. Ray White Rural does not accept any liability for any accident, damage, injury to horses, riders, beast, ground, spectators or any other person or property whatsoever.
